

Second annual Stars For a Dark Night brings community together in remembering loved ones

On the darkest night, we see the most stars. Throughout the month of December, the Peterborough Public Library lobby was filled with stars for Hospice Peterborough's second annual community installation of Stars for a Dark Night. A total of 278 stars were contributed, each representing someone remembered, someone loved.

Most stars simply shared a loved one's name, or were decorated with stickers or other images that were connected to the person represented on the star. Other stars shared heartfelt messages of support for those grieving.

"We had a lot of engagement from the community and received a lot of gratitude from folks for the opportunity to honour their loved ones and express their grief for those who have died," shares Mark Stewart, Library Services Manager at Peterborough Public Library. "It's clearly something our community needs and I think it really helped to bring people together."

The Stars installation also included a short memorial ceremony that took place in the late afternoon of Thursday, December 19. The event included a short candle-lighting reflection led by Hospice Peterborough's Family & Child Life Specialist, Sheila McPherson, an opportunity for attendees to share the names of those who had died, and an offering of song from the Hospice Singers, a community bedside singing group.

Recognizing the importance of ensuring everyone in the community had access to stars, Hospice Peterborough volunteers led two star-making sessions at One City PTBO's Trinity Community Centre, where guests and staff shared stories and memories of loved ones who have died.



Stars for a Dark Night also took place at Hospice Norwood, in partnership with Hospice Peterborough, where the community's stars were displayed in the facility's front window (pictured left).

Hospice Peterborough plans to grow and evolve the event each year, ensuring there are opportunities for everyone in our community to come together, grieve, and remember. Stay tuned for the 2025 Stars for a Dark Night which will once again take place at Peterborough Public Library in December!


Hospice Peterborough was delighted to participate in Central Smith's Fill the Truck campaign, along with several other local participants.

Fill the Truck invites local organizations to collect food donations throughout the month of December for Kawartha Food Share.

According to the program's lead organizer Shannon Meagher, over the past 4 years, the program has collectively provided Kawartha Food Share with approximately 37,000lbs of food and \$33,000!

In 2024, Fill the Truck raised over \$3,000 and collected 6,600lbs of food.

Are you interested in volunteering at Hospice? Our 30-hour Volunteer Training is HPCO-standardized training, and is mandatory for anyone who wishes to volunteer with Hospice clients.

Training at Hospice Peterborough will begin Monday, April 7 and will be held for 10 consecutive weeks on Monday evenings from 6-9pm.

Prior to being accepted into the training, interested participants must attend a 1hr orientation at Hospice Peterborough (dates & times TBA), followed by a one-on-one interview with Volunteer Services staff.

When: Second and fourth Thursday of each month, from 1pm to 2pm.


